Summer Taxes 2023



Taxes are payable July 1st, 2023 thru September 14th, 2023 without penalty.

After September 14th, an additional 1% penalty will be added until February 14th, 2024, on any **unpaid** balance.

After the 14th, an additional 3% penalty will be added until February 28th, 2024.

March 1st, 2024 all delinquent taxes are sent to the Lapeer County Treasurer @ 255 Clay St. Suite 303 Lapeer, MI 48446.

Partial payments are accepted at any time during those dates.

When paying your summer taxes for 2023, please include the bottom portion of your tax bill with your payment. Make checks payable to **Metamora Township**. Include your property number and a current phone number.

Disabled Veteran's Exemption Information



If you qualify for the disabled Veteran's Exemption, please make sure to turn in the proper paperwork in to our office as soon as possible in order to be exempt for the 2023 tax season. You must be **100% disabled to qualify.**

Summer Deferment

You can also research article Under MCL 211.51 & Act 24 of 2005 section 51, property taxpayers may defer until *February 14th*, without penalty or interest, the due date of their summer taxes on their homestead. If their household income for the preceding calendar year did not exceed **\$40,000** and they are:

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| <p>A. 62 years of age or older, including the unmarried surviving spouse of a person who was 62 years of age or older at the time of death;</p> <p>B. A paraplegic or quadriplegic;</p> | <p>C. An eligible serviceperson, eligible veteran, or their eligible widow or widower;</p> <p>D. A blind person; or</p> <p>E. A totally and permanently disabled person.</p> <p>F. An eligible serviceman, eligible veteran, or their eligible widow or widower;</p> <p>G. A Blind person; or</p> | <p>H. A totally and permanently disabled person.</p> |
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Property that is classified or used as agricultural property, may qualify if the gross receipts of the farming operations are not less than the household income of the owner in the previous year.

This deferral means you must pay the taxes, but can wait until February 14th without paying any interest or penalty. Persons applying for a deferral must certify that they qualify for the deferral on a deferral form obtained from the Treasurer's office or on the township website. This form must be completed and filed with the Township by September 14th of each year to receive the deferral.
